Mrs. Banfield wore an ice blue silk worsted dress and Mrs. Hansen was in beige.

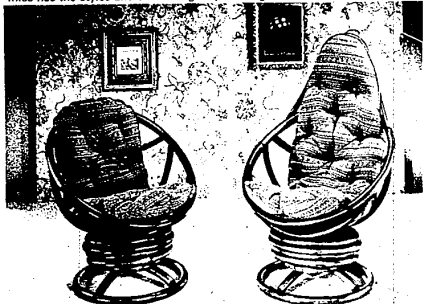

Two items too large for a Christmas stocking highlighted Detroit Edison's "What's New Electrically" show. There were also many everyday items with a new look to make the ladies start hinting. Strictly out of Buck Rogers and the space age or Ruben

Goldberg was the surprise showing of the new "Mowbot," the suburbanites dream come true, a lawn mower that runs itself. All you have to do is surround the perimeter of your lawn with wire an inch underground, turn a couple of switches and let the Mowbot do the job. The price tag on

this is \$200. Men and boys would love it.

FOR THE WOMEN, a great new gadget is the Whirlpool Trash Masher. About half the size of a portable dishwasher, it exerts 1,000 pound of pressure.

If you have a family of four, you have one bag of garbage per week after it has been crushed and compressed in the machine. The outfit also includes a spray which automatically eliminates odors and keeps bugs away.

Kids would love it too, and so you don't have compressed kids instead of crushed garbage, it comes with a key which must be turned on before it operates.

The Trash Masher is now available in several local department stores at \$229.95, and is selling well according to reports.

IN THE REALM of the Christmas stocking and the hints to hobby, you might like the new Proctor Silex steam and dry iron. The part where the water goes in is of heavy-duty see-through plastic. Not only can you tell at a glance when the iron needs water, you can also use tap water without a qualm because the plastic won't corrode.

Or how about a Hoover Fend-Pan, a little on the expensive side at \$45, but very practical since the bottom can also be used as a mini-frying pan.

The pistol-grip hair dryer by Oster not only dries hair, human or canine, but also can

used imaginatively to defrost refrigerators, cool you off on a hot day or warm a stiff neck.

A COUPLE of ITEMS were particularly smart in wood grain finish, including the Remington hot roll steamer with an attachment for boiling or poaching four eggs at a time.

For people who have everything, the show suggested a cordless blender by Waring would be great for mixing drinks on the patio or at a picnic (maybe even on a hunting trip), along with Oster cordless can opener.

For the woman who has everything and likes to travel the Sunbeam lighted mini mirror might be a good suggestion. It is very compact and features a light and two mirrors, regular and magnifying.

APARTMENT and mobile home dwellers would be well advised to take a look at new small washers and dryers. It's hard to choose between the Maytag portable outfit and the Frigidaire Laundry Center.

And in new ranges, you can take your pick of a Kelvinator with an automatic baster (a little scoop picks up sauce on each revolution and dribbles it over the roast), or a Corning range with the easy-to-keep-clean top.

Maybe you'd like to forget about the conventional range and invest in a Tupperware Magic Range which gives outlets for electric pans (five are included) plus a very nice warming shelf on top.
