machines provide high-sol removal and low-sol repositioning—the goals of high-quality drycleaning.

"The combination of Valence drycleaning fluid, the Valc Machine, and the expert finishing make it the most versatile system available," said Grimes.

He pointed out that only the

new plant will initially have equipment specially designed to use Valence.

However, with the truck pickup and delivery service, customers who have garments requiring the gentle cleaning of Valence may leave clothes at either of the other locations.

"The new system," he added, "is the modern solution to today's drycleaning needs—

new fashions, new materials, and new handling requirements."

These combinations require safe and gentle cleaning and place new and rigorous demands on the drycleaner. Valence has a number of special properties and performance advantages over the conventional drycleaning systems which use petroleum and

perchloroethylene solvents. Because of the special properties of Valence drycleaning fluid, equipment manufacturers have now been able to make machines that economically provide brighter and whiter looking garments.

One reason for this is the high-performance detergent in Valence which effectively removes soils while minimizing soil redistribution.

Another reason is that the low surface tension of Valence enables it to wet-out garments easily and thoroughly to get into creases and tightly woven fabrics for flushing out or dissolving soils.

In addition Valence permits cleaning systems which have a clean charge, without residue carry-over, for each new load. This provides for maximum cleaning during each cycle.

THE SOLVENCY action of Valence, although more than adequate for normal soil removal, is slightly lower than the average for petroleum solvents.

The use of Valence in the drycleaning operation minimizes dye bleeding and harmful effects to buttons and ornaments.

Gentle solvency also means less extraction of natural oils, dyes, and adhesives, the removal of which can be detrimental to fabrics, laminates, trims, and finishes.

The high volatility of Valence drycleaning fluid permits rapid drying of garments with little or no heat being required. The elimination of high temperature drying minimizes shrinkage, prevents heat-setting of spots and stains, and enables suedes, leather and fur to remain supple and soft.

A short drying time also minimizes the tumbling action required. This means less distortion and provides longer life of soft, fragile fabrics and allows less chance of abrasion damage to trim, jewels, and similar ornamentation.

Valence drycleaning fluid has been successfully used with fabrics and garments that require gentle cleaning such as: laminated fabrics; bonded fabrics; leathers; suedes; sheepskins; draperies; jeweled or ornamented garments; fur-lined or trimmed coats; and hunting coats with rubber pockets.

COUNTY OF OAKLAND, STATE OF MICHIGAN

Notice is hereby given that in conformity with the "Michigan Election Law", the undersigned Clerk, will upon every day, except Tuesday and a legal holiday, the day of any regular or special election or primary election, receive for deposit the names of any legal voters in said Township, City or Village not already registered who may APPLY TO ME PERSONALLY for such registration.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT I WILL BE AT MY OFFICE

Friday, October 2, 1970 -- Last Day

From 8 o'clock a.m. until 8 o'clock p.m.

The Fifth Friday preceding said Election

And on Saturday, September 26, 1970

8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

As provided by Section 499, Act No. 116, Public Acts of 1924 As Amended, from 8 o'clock a.m. until 8 o'clock p.m. on said day for the purpose of REVIEWING the REGISTRATION and REGISTERING such of the qualified electors in said TOWNSHIP, CITY or VILLAGE as SHALL PROPERLY apply therefor.

In addition the Clerk's Office will be open from 8 o'clock a.m. until 8 o'clock p.m. on the Saturday preceding the Fifth Friday.

The names of any person for an ACTUAL RESIDENT of the precinct at the time of registration, and verified under the Constitution, furnishing such notice, in view of the near election, shall be entered in the registration book.

### ELECTOR UNABLE TO MAKE PERSONAL APPLICATION, PROCEDURE

SEC. 504. Any elector who is unable to make personal application for registration because of physical disability or absence from the Township, City or Village in which his legal residence is located, may be registered prior to the date of registration by a qualified elector or primary election by securing from the Clerk of the Township, City or Village in which he is located his legal residence, duplicate registration card and attaching to the registration card a check of the registration records of the Township, City or Village showing the elector's name and address as shown on the original and duplicate registration cards, and shall place the original registration card in the precinct file. Such transfers shall not be made after the last day of registration prior to any election or primary election. The nature public or other official conducting the work shall sign his name on the file for the signature of the registration officer and designate his title.

### UNREGISTERED PERSONS NOT ENTITLED TO VOTE

SEC. 491. The elector of election at any election or primary election in this State, or in any District, County, Township, City or Village thereof, shall not receive the vote of any person whose name is not registered in the registration book of the Township, Ward or Precinct in which he offers to vote. (As provided under Act 116, P. A. 1924.)

### TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION, APPLICATION, TIME

SEC. 506. Any registered elector may upon change of residence within the Township, City or Village cause his registration to be transferred to his new address by sending to the Clerk a signed request, stating his present address, the date he moved thereto, and the address from which he was last registered, or by applying in person for a transfer. The Clerk shall strike through the last address, ward and precinct number and record the new address, ward and precinct number on the original and duplicate registration cards, and shall place the original registration card in the precinct file. Such transfers shall not be made after the Fifth Friday next preceding any election or primary election. The nature public or other official conducting the work shall sign his name on the file for the signature of the registration officer and designate his title.

### TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION ON ELECTION DAY

SEC. 507. Any registered elector who has removed from one election precinct of a Township, City or Village to another election precinct of the same Township, City or Village and has not recorded such removal with the local Clerk shall receive a transfer of registration request, listing the new residence address thereon and his signature, with the election board in the precinct in which he is registered at the next ensuing primary or election. The elector of election in charge of the registration records shall compare the signature thereon with the signature upon the elector's registration record and, if the signature corresponds, then the elector shall certify such fact by attaching his initials upon said request. The elector, by sending such request to the Clerk, shall be deemed to have transferred his registration to the precinct in which he is registered. When the names of any street in a Township, City or Village has been changed, it shall be the duty of the Township, City or Village Clerk to make the change in the proper name of street in the registration records, and it shall not be necessary for the elector to change his registration with respect thereto in order to be eligible to vote.
