Fire Destroys Realty Firm Office

FARMINGTON Fire broke out early Friday morning and destroyed two-thirds of the Real Estate One office building at 2700 Orchard Lake Rd. in Farmington Township.

The office center, opened two years ago, was built and operated by Robert Bergstrom, who is a general insurance agent and president of Glen Oaks Corp., which built the center.

THE FIRE, which started at 4 a.m. on Sept. 11, caused \$325,000 damage to the building. Total damage, including contents, has been estimated at about \$500,000.

The fire is believed to have started because of a faulty operation of the furnace. Thursday night was one of the first cool nights of this fall, and the furnace had kicked on to heat the building.

Within five hours of the blaze, at 9 a.m., Bergstrom had set up a temporary insurance office in the basement of his home at 3297 Pipers Lane in Kimberly subdivision, Farmington Township. His new business phone number is 474-4492.

Vice president of the Glen Oaks Corp., which owned the office center, is attorney, Harold Larsen. Secretary-treasurer is Dan Williamson.

Carry a make-your-own skin freshener in purse: a small sponge dipped in your favorite astringent and tucked into plastic powder-puff case.

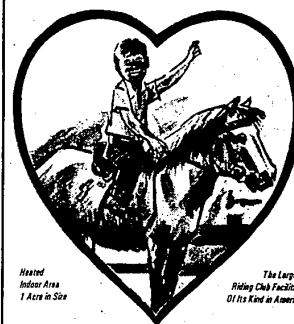

Ed says that he had a smaller petunia tree last year and it worked out so well that he decided to enlarge it this

year. He starts with a 100-gallon wood barrel, cut in half and drilled with holes. A 12-inch wire tube eight feet high, with 1 1/4 inch holes is placed in the center of the barrel.

The barrel and the wire tube are both filled with peat moss. Petunia plants of various colors (Ed chose white, red and purple) are planted about six inches apart in the holes of the barrel and the wire tube. The petunia tree in bloom is a

magnificent sight, practically covered with blooms.

The whole family takes an interest in the petunia tree, keeping it free of the expired blooms. I guess this is what you would call "Flower Power."

Women May Join

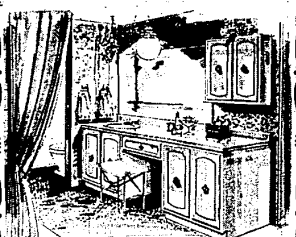

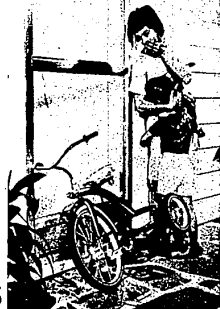
