

Observerland tankers vie in Junior Olympics

Several swimmers from two area clubs have earned berths in the National Junior Olympics, slated for April in Orlando, Fla.

Competitors from the Livonia Spartan Aquatic Club and Clarenceville Swim Club secured spots after placing last weekend (Jan. 31-Feb. 1) in Circle City A-B Invitational on the campus of Indiana-Purdue University-Indianapolis (IUPUI), site of the 1984 U.S. Olympic Trials.

The meet, drawing 39 teams from seven states, featured the Livonia Spartans' Troy Shumate taking high-point honors in the Boys 11-12 age group.

Shumate won all seven of his events including the 50, 100, 200 and 500 freestyles; 100 backstroke, 100 butterfly and 200 individual medley. He was clocked in 53.3 for the 100 freestyle.

Clarenceville's Sheila Taormina was runner-up in points for Girls 15-18. She was first in the 50 freestyle, second in the 100 and 200 butterfly, 200 freestyle, 200 and 400 IM.

THE SPARTANS' Michele McKenzie also placed high in the Girls 15-18, taking first in the 500 freestyle, third in the 200 backstroke, 200 IM, 200 and 1,650 freestyle; and fourth, 100 IM and 100 freestyle. Teammate Ann Bollinger was third in the 100 backstroke, fourth in the 50 freestyle and 200 backstroke, fifth in the 100 and 200 freestyles; and seventh in the 200 IM.

Clarenceville's Mark Papierski was third in Boys 15-18 with thirds in the 200 IM and 100 breaststroke, fourth in the 100 and 200 backstroke and 200 breaststroke.

The Spartans were second overall in the team standings with 1,639 points.
