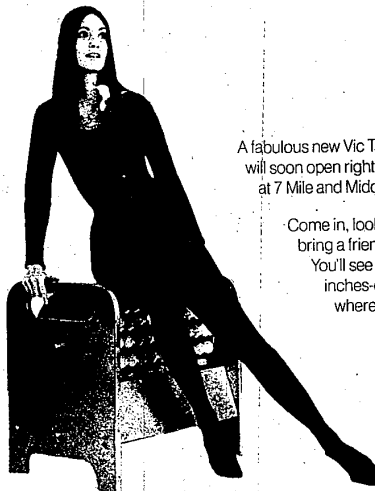
The club has chosen "Wider Horizons" as its theme for the year. Mrs. George Middlewood
