Vintage recipes served with vintage fashions

Columnist Carol Tegard and Farmington Artist-In-Residence Lois Bro will headline as guest commentators for a Historical Fashion Show and Luncheon at noon Thursday, March 13 at the Botsford Inn.

Embarking on the third event of its spirited sesquicentennial anniversary activities, the occasion will showcase a collection of vintage fashions belonging

to Farmington Players.

Beginning with a welcoming reception, the luncheon bill-of-fare will feature foods prepared from recipes that date back to the mid-nineteenth century in the Detroit area.

Following the program, guests will have an opportunity to view the just-published book, "More Than A Tavern — 150 Years of the Botsford Inn," a

Rotary now 81

The Rotary Club of Farmington celebrated the 81st anniversary of Rotary International at a luncheon Feb. 25 at Glenpollis restaurant, Farmington Hills.

Rotary District Governor Arden Deert cut the birthday cake to honor the anniversary celebration.

Special guest and speaker for the event was Bill Ives, past director of Rotary International for 1983-85.

Ives pointed out that Rotary is the oldest service club — now with 23,000 clubs, one-million members in 160 countries.

He talked about some of Rotary's current goals, which include project 2005 to eliminate polio by the year 2005. Currently, 54 million doses of vaccine have been distributed worldwide.

Ives noted that Rotary International's exchange program included 8,000 exchange students this year and is continuing to grow.


