eaving a limited partnership may be difficult

The reason is that the life of a part-nership is usually 7-15 years. So, if you wish to sell your investment before the scheduled liquidation, you may be forced to find a buyer by yourself, which is not a comforting thought.

Fortunately, the National Partner-ship Exchange in St. Petershurg, Fla., reportedly lists units for sale from an authorized cable of 500 pensions. You must use a broker affillated with that exchange in order to transact business there.

Units of more than two dozen master partnerships are traded like stock on either the New York or American stock exchange or over-the-counter. These units, mostly involving oil and natural gas are formed by combining a number of existing traditional partnerships or from assets spun off from an oil firm. Most limited partnership, you are likely to sulfer a sever loss.

Even for an excellent shelter with a bright future, the sale price may be an hird of its current worth, not counting the front load you intitally paid when you joined the partnership.

And don't lose sight of the serious ad-

tacting your general partner. Some-times general partners buy back their units, although the total amount of such purchases may be limited during given time period. If he cannot buy your unit himself, the general partner may give you leads on other potential bayers. If you gought your units through a large stockbroker, the firm may be able to

help you find a buyer among its other clients. An alternative is to contact one of the firmst that seek shelter interests. For instance, the Liquidity Fund in Cai-ifornia deals in 300 to 400 real estate

REGARDLESS OF whether you are able to liquidate your investment in limited partnerships, you would be well advised to invest in a tax shelter only if you can hold it until its proper liquidation date. While there exist a few early liquidation opportunities, it is highly desireable not to count on them.
