Raiders 2nd at regional, advance to state

North Farmington and Troy High switched roles at last weekend's state gymnastics regional, leaving one of the two traditionally strong teams still alive as the season reaches its ultimate

The Raiders, who falled to qualify as a team for the state meet the past two years, went into Saturday's competition with the host Colts, who were looking for their seventh straight regional crown.

When it was over, North Farmington survived.

North, on the strength on a balanced individual attack, just missed the overall title, scoring 133.15 to St. Clair Shores Lakeview's 133.20. Troy was third with 130.90 and missed out on sending its team to state since only the top two move on.

"I was surprised at how good they were," North coach Mary Glitz said of Lakeview. "We don't compete against them during the year, so we didn't know anything about them, but they

"I knew we could do as well as we did. We started first on beam, and I think our girls were a little nervous. We scored low on beam, but we came back after that."

LAKEVIEW AND North will be two of eight going after the team title this week at Grand Rapids Creston High School. In addition to team competition, the top six all-around finishers from the four regionals will compete, as will the top eight placers in each event.

Team and all-around champions will be determined Friday night, while indi-vidual titles will be awarded after competition Friday and Saturday.

Also competing for the team title will be Jackson County Western, Ann Arbor Pioneer, Holland, Rockford, Freeland and Traverse City.

County Western, a team that scored around 133.0 most of the year, totated 140.55 at its own regional.

"We don't know a lot about the other teams there, but we know if Holland and Freeland are there, it will be tough," Glitz said. "We'll go in there and do the best we can. I know the girls are excited about going."

Individually, five performers stood out and placed in the top six in all-around. Rochester's Lisa Rotondo led the group, placing first in all-around with a career high 35.65.

Dahn was first on beam (8.85), fifth on bars (8.8) and sixth on vault (9.05) and floor (8.8).

"Katle was driving toward the last three meets (league, regional and state)." Scaholm coach Sue Chrostek said. "As a senior, the season wasn't critical until the last three meets. She worked real hard and polished things up and it all happened for her Saturday."

TWO FARMINGTON gymnasts, Elecen Murtaugh from North and Tana Burningham from Harrison, also qualified for the state meet in all-around. Murtaugh, the cream of the Ralders' talented crop, was fourth in all-around with a 35.30, while Burningham was right behind with a 35.25.

Murtaugh was second in floor (9.2) and third on bars (9.1), while Burningham was first on vault (9.4), third on beam (8.55) and fifth in floor (8.85).

Troy's Suzanne Enciso, who finished sixth in all-around with a 35.05, was first in floor (9.35), second in vault (9.25) and seventh on beam (8.3). Teammate Jodic Gleeson was the only other Troy qualifier for the state meet as she was eighth on bars (8.6).

Other state qualifers were North's Lucine Toroyan (9.0 for fourth on vault), Athens' Natalle Leich (9.1 for fourth on vault and 8.3 for sixth in floor), Rochester's Becky Meredith (8.5 for second on beam and 8.75 for eighth in floor), Andover's Midge Cohen (8.5 for flifth on beam) and North's Kara Karbu (8.9 for fourth in floor).

far as I'm concerned."




