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Tornadoes When a twister is sighted, know what to do

To help stimulate public interest and awareness in tornado safety, Gary Coon, Michigan State University, designated March 22 as Michigan Tornado Safety Week.

As a result of that twisterdown near Orchard Lake and 15 Mile roads, a 15-year-old girl was killed, more than 50 were injured and property damage topped \$5 million.

The thing about tornadoes is that they can hit anywhere, anytime. Nobody can predict where they'll hit or not hit," said Gary Coon, Farmington Department of Public Safety deputy director.

Should the siren sound in threatening weather, don't call the police dispatcher unless you have a fire or medical emergency to report. Take basic precautions, like making sure the stove is off, and take cover quickly.

A siren sounding doesn't necessarily mean a tornado has been spotted locally. All sirens in Oakland County are activated by either the National Weather Service or Oakland County. And all are off, rather than just those in a specific area of the county.
