Girls Camp located near Port Sanitar, and as neighborhood recreational vehicles during non-camp seasons. The vehicles presently owned by the CYO are 1967, 1968 and 1973 vintage. After numerous patchings and repairs, all three succumbed to old age last summer.

Don't park in their place

A handicapped parking place is not a special privilege for a disabled person, says the national commander of Disabled American Veterans. "It is not even a convenience," he adds. "It is a necessity."

Edward Gallan points out that DAV is not asking for sympathy.

He explains that spots close to stores are what handicapped people need. "It may be a pain in the neck for an able-

bodied person to walk a much longer distance with a loaded shopping bag in each hand," he notes.

"But think of someone carrying a heavy load over that same distance on artificial legs. It can cause serious pain, perhaps even bleeding. And the person wearing prosthetic legs is more susceptible to falling than an able-bodied person."
