## Black moles on the rise

A form of skin cancer where moles turn black (malignant melanoma) is on the increase as people get more exposure to the sun.

A group of Harper-Grace physicians, in a joint effort with the Meyer L. Prentiss Comprehensive Cancer Center of Metropolitan Detroit and Wayne State University School of Medicine, have set up a program to diagnose and treat such moles and other pigmented lesions and skin disorders.

The program is believed to be the only one of its kind in Michigan.

## Cancer society to spend \$85 million in research

The American Cancer Society will spend \$85 million on cancer research in 1986. The massive commitment, \$16 million more than the \$69 million spent on scientific and medical studies in 1985, constitutes 30.2 percent of the society's total budget.

In Michigan, the society will fund \$2.9 million in research projects at University of Michigan, Wayne State University and Michigan State University.

"The American Cancer Society's actual financial expenditures are more than matched by the expenditures in energy and creativity of our 80,000 volunteers," said Lonson L. Barr, state president of the ACS. "They carry out our education programs, visit patients, inform legislators, assist in our offices, and raise funds. Their efforts ensure that contribution to the society have an impact far beyond dollars and cents."

The ACS 1986 statistical survey, "Cancer Facts & Figures," estimates that 34,500 cases of cancer will be diagnosed in Michigan in the coming year, and that an estimated 17,200 men and women will die of the disease.

For the second year, breast cancer has fallen behind lung cancer in estimated causes of cancer deaths among women. This rising trend of lung cancer among women is believed to reflect the pace at which women have taken up cigarette smoking, while the incidence of breast cancer in the U.S. has remained fairly constant over the past 50 years.

In Michigan, lung cancer continues to be the number-one cause of cancer deaths, with an estimated 5,500 new cases diagnosed and 4,800 deaths.
