Intersary celebration. Communities throughout the state are already planning their involvement in the state's birthday. For example, next year's Farmington Founders Festival will be dedicated to the state's sesquicentendlal, Tuttle said.

For starters, the commission has established a foundation charged with raising money for the year's worth of activities, Tuttle said.

The state celebration will also be a time to remind Michigan residents of what their state offers. Quoting Gov. James Blanchard, Tuttle said the sesquicentennial will be a time for looking back at the state's history as well as for looking ahead into the state's future.

ALTHOUGH MICHIGAN is known for the auto industry, there's more to the state than manufacturing plants, Tuttle sald. "We're also big in tour-ism and agriculture. We produce a majority of the world's navy beans, apples and cherries. And our wines

The commission's publicity plans revolve around the theme, "Come Home to Michigan." Flyers and notices will be issued to the media to begin promoting the theme, Tuttle said.

A commemorative stamp has been commissioned for the states 150th birthday. Although the stamp will be designed by a Michigan artist, the U.S. Postal Service will not identify the artist, Puttle said.

While Michigan is gearing up for its celebration, the Smithsonian Institute in Washington D.C. is planning a big exhibit about the state, Tuttle said.

HIGHLIGHTS OF the state's celebration include a tall ships regatta, ending at Traverse City next summer to coincide with the close of the National Governor's Conference at Grand Traverse Resort. President Reagan is expected to attend the conference, Tuttle said.

Other events include the unveiling of the Heritage Center, which will house the state museum, archives and library.
