

Creativity wins awards for youth

Fourteen youngsters have won awards for their creative efforts in art, music and literature in PTA's Reflections program. This year's theme is "From Liberty's View". The annual contest is designed to encourage creative expression and generate creative efforts in the fine arts by challenging the student's skills and originality.

Inge-Lisa Bessner, a student at Flanders, took the first-place spot for her art work in the kindergarten-

to-third-grade category, followed by Matthew Patton from Flanders and Joshua Klemm from Kenbrook.

For art work submitted by fourth-to-sixth graders, Michelle Weising from Longacre took first place, followed by Paul O'Brien from Gill.

Michael Merenda from Eagle Elementary took first place among musicians in kindergarten through the third grade.

THE FIRST-PLACE award for

musicians in fourth-sixth grades went to Christopher Temporelli and second to Stephanie David, both students at Longacre.

In literature, Alexa Ervasti from Kenbrook led the kindergarten-to-third grade field, followed by Kathleen Clinnard from Longacre and Marjorie Rudick from Eagle.

In the literature category for fourth-to-sixth graders, Rebecca Koning from Longacre came in first, followed by Heather Stoeckman from

Kenbrook and Brandi Brower from Gill.

The young artists submitted paintings, drawings, collage or printmaking. Poetry, prose or dram came from the students who entered the literature category. Scores of original composition, with or without words, were submitted by the budding musicians.

The works of the 14 winners from this area are on their way to be judged at the state level.

Membership of the Farmington Musicales includes 60 area women. The organization is a member of the Michigan and National Federation of Music Clubs.

B'nai B'rith elects community leader

Barbara Zonder, organizer of the first Healthy Baby Week in the metro area, has been elected to a second term as a member of the executive board of B'nai B'rith Women (BBW).

Farmington resident, Zonder has been BBW's national Operation Stork chairman, administering a nationwide program geared to educating young pregnant women about preventing birth defects.

She was honored by the National Foundation-March of Dimes with its Leadership Award for Program Initiation in 1978. Healthy Baby Week programs have culminated in day long events at Northland Center, Southfield.

ZONDER initiated the coalition of BBW, the March of Dimes, Detroit's Henry Ford Hospital, and the Zeta Phi Beta sorority to form Stork's Nest II, an incentive program to promote good prenatal care and educate pregnant women about birth defects.

She also developed BBW's Dolls

for Democracy, a human relations program for the Farmington Schools district.

She presently serves on the boards of Michigan Region B'nai B'rith Youth organizations, the Anti-Defamation League and Wayne State University Hill.

She and her husband, Michael, have a son and a daughter.

Zonder's election came during the recent BBW International Biennial Convention in Las Vegas.

Susan Weidman Schneider, a convention speaker, told the assembly that in the 1980s "Jewish women are gaining power in the outside world."

"THEY ARE are the best educated group of women in America and best able to take advantage of the jobs that are opening."

Jacqueline Levine, another speaker, told delegates "Women have issues we care about. Who else is going to care about these issues. Our job is to get these issues on the agenda of the Jewish organizations."

Patricia Neal received the BBW's Pearlman Award for Human Advancement during the convention. She was recognized for her work on behalf of the disabled and for her support of the rehabilitation center named for her in her hometown of Knoxville, Tenn.
