Quaker meetings were held in the homes of Arthur Power of Farmington in 1827; Erastus Hussey of Plymouth, in 1828; David Lapham of Livonia, in 1827; and Alasson Aldrich of Northville, in 1828. Two permanet groups were organized, at Farmington in, 1831, and, at Plymouth in 1834.

The Livonia meeting house, built in 1846, still stands on Seven Mile Road. Now known as Quaker Ares, it has been purchased by the City of Livonia.
