23 in the early 1980s. Eleven percent of the volunteers are 50 or older, including the oldest volunteer, 84-year-old Odell Long, who is working in Haiti.

"We certainly are going to continue to encourage older Americans to join. You know, age is respected in the countries the Peace Corps serves."

But most Peace Corps still are college graduates or younger. Ruppe said the agency is the biggest employer of college students in the United States.

She said joining the corps also can be a good career move. The U.S. State Department employs 1,000 former Peace Corps volunteers and 14 of the 16 directors of Chase Manhattan Bank are former volunteers.

To renew interest in the Peace Corps and celebrate its anniversary, some 35 symposiums have been scheduled throughout the United States, Ruppe said. A major, two-day symposium is planned for Oct. 7 at the University of Michigan. Ruppe will participate along with Vice President George Bush, Sargent Shriver, the first Peace Corps director, and many former volunteers.
