Two Boy Scouts attained the Eagle award, the highest award in scouting, recently at a court of honor.

David John Corell, son of Jeri Cor-

rell of Farmington Hills and Don Corell of Farmington, is a 16-year-old sophomore at Farmington High School. Daniel Lee Smith Jr., son of Dan and Esta Smith of Farmington

Hills, is a 17-year-old junior at Harrison High School.

Corell is a member of Boy Scout Troop 389, Nardin Park Unit Methodist Church. His service project, required to attain the Eagle status, included refueling the Sunday school table and building a lawn for St. John Lutheran Church, Farmington. Corell was confirmed last year in the church and is an active member.

He spends a week each summer at Lost Lake Scout Reservation and served in the Governor's Honor Guard in 1984 at Mackinac Island. The awards he's earned in scouting include the Order of the Arrow, World Crest Scout, Cedar Bay Pioneers and the Baden Powell Award.

Corell enjoys camping, hiking and soccer. A member of Farmington YMCA, he lifts weights and swims. He was an Observer carrier and now works at the Ram's Horn Farmington Hills.

Smith joined the scouts in February 1980. For his Eagle project, he improved a nature area at the Farmington Community Center. That included clearing an area of fallen trees and debris and installing a viewing bench.

He has served as troop librarian, quartermaster, patrol leader and senior patrol leader. A member of the Order of the Arrow, he has hiked the Potawatomi, Wright Memorial, Pontiac and Bald Mountain trails. He's attended Lost Lake Scout Camp for five years and served as a junior camp counselor in 1984.

A member of Orchard United Methodist Church, he's served as the sound manager of the teen choir. At Harrison High School, he's been active in the marching and concert bands.

He's also worked at Mama Loricchio's in Farmington Hills. He plans a career in electronics, radio and television broadcasting.

Men needed to help camp

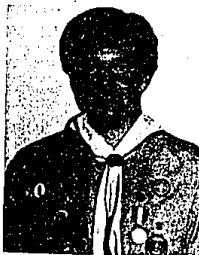

Speech program offered to children

Communications Disorders Inc. offers a summer speech and language program for elementary- and preschool-age children. The program offers a way to bridge the treatment gap many children experience during the summer months.

The program is offered from June 23 to Aug. 8 in Botsford General Hospital, 28050 Grand River, Farmington Hills.

The children will be grouped according to age, type and severity of disability.

Placement will be contingent upon referral by the public school, hospital or clinical speech pathologist.

At the end of seven weeks a final report will be sent to the family and upon request, to the referring speech pathologist.

The program is supervised by Kathleen Powell.

Referrals must be submitted by May 30. Parents will be informed of placement by June 13.

An assessment of each child's current level of functioning along with individual educational plan objectives must be submitted by the referring agency in order for that child to be placed in the program.

Referral forms will be sent to each school district. For those children who haven't been evaluated, a diagnostic session may be arranged for an additional \$40. Additional forms are available upon request.

The referring speech pathologist is asked to discuss the program and the tuition costs with parents. Applications must be forwarded to Communications Disorders Inc., 28240 Franklin, Southfield 48064. For more information, call Communication Disorders at 356-1779.

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Understanding scleroderma

It's an illness that afflicts an estimated several hundred thousand Americans but it remains relatively unknown. Scleroderma is a chronic disease without a known cause or cure.

Difficult to diagnose, the disease first affects the sufferer's hands. The skin becomes tight and hard. Muscle and joint pain, fatigue, weight loss, hair loss, edema, swallowing difficulties and any number of non-specific complaints can follow.

The United Scleroderma Foundation has declared June 8-15 national scleroderma awareness week. The foundation's Southeastern Michigan Chapter meets Wednesday, June 2.

For more information about the group call the area office, 334-9900. Scleroderma strikes women at a four to one ratio over men. The condition can involve the entire body or can be limited to skin or the skin plus bone and muscle. Treatment is limited to general supportive drugs and physical therapy.
