

# OCC joins SEMCOG — 2nd 2-year college

Oakland Community College has become the second two-year college to join the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments.

The OCC board's next task will be to pick a delegate and alternate to the 130-member General Assembly of the seven-county regional planning agency.

OCC Chancellor R. Stephen Nicholson persuaded the board that the \$2,650 in dues is "very cost efficient" because of the research SEMCOG does.

The board voted 5-0 without discussion to join SEMCOG, but it was a major breakthrough for both institutions.

Intermediate school districts and K-12 districts is dwarfed by the city, township and county blocs.

OCC itself had been a hold-out from professional and regional groups for the first 15 years of its existence. Only in the late 1970s, under then-President Robert F. Roelofs, did it begin to join professional associations.

Nevertheless, trustee David Hackett asked Nicholson to report back in a year "on how much service we actually use" from SEMCOG, headquartered in the Book Building in downtown Detroit.

Hackett added, "I would like to have all the reports we ask for to be tabulated. I forget what we ask for."

NICHOLSON'S memo to the board said SEMCOG could make graphs on population concentrations, road planning and construction issues which impact on OCC.

"It is especially critical that OCC be part of SEMCOG at a time when a growth of up to 200,000 additional jobs by 1995 could severely impact the roads around our campuses," he said.

As a SEMCOG member, OCC can participate in decisions affecting transportation, economic development, environmental strategy and federal grants, the chancellor said.

DETROIT 200 patrons may find themselves parking in the OCC structure in Royal Oak for 16 days in June, July and August — and it will be money in the college's pocket.

The college board approved a rental agreement whereby the zoo would pay \$1,000 per day for using the college's parking structure. When college groundskeeping and security costs are subtracted, OCC expects a total income of \$11,200.

according to business vice president Anthony Jason.

The zoo expects to be short of parking space due to I-96 freeway construction this year. Zoo patrons will use OCC's structure on 14 Sundays in June, July and August and two Saturdays — July 19 and Aug. 16. Patrons will pay \$2 per vehicle and be shuttled back and forth to the zoo.

OCC's parking structure has 780 spaces serving the Royal Oak portion of the Southeast Campus System.

A PRESIDENT-for the Southeast Campus System is expected to be recommended by July, Chancellor Nicholson told trustees.

"Unless they tell us they're not interested, (unsuccessful applicants) will be put in the pool for the Orchard Ridge presidency," Nicholson added.

Southwest Chancellor Walter J. Fichtmaster is retiring, and Orchard Ridge Campus President James Stevenson will leave to become president of Muskegon Community College.

Nicholson said he hoped a recommendation for the position at Orchard Ridge in Farmington Hills could be made by early August.

OCC maintains a small central staff in Bloomfield Hills headed by the chancellor. Teaching is done on four campuses.

FOUR HOSPITALS have approved "affiliation agreements" whereby they will take OCC students for on-the-job training. The OCC board authorized Reynolds to sign the agreements.

William Beaumont Hospital, Royal Oak, will take nursing students from Highland Lakes.

The Southeast Campus System (Southfield building) will provide diagnostic medical sonography students for Saratoga Community Hospital and Grace Northwest Hospital in Detroit.
