The Council has scheduled public hearings to consider: rezoning from RA-1 to IRO on the west side of Halsted, south of I-696; vacation of utility and drainage easements for Orchard Place Apartments in Sec-

tion 2; vacation of a portion of an alley in assessor's Richland State subdivision, between Jacksonville Street and Jefferson Avenue; to re-name portion of 11 Mile, east of Drake Road, to Pleasant Valley Road; resolution of determination for watermain installation on Richmond Hill and Northbrook Lane and setting of public hearing on costs; approval of proposed 1986/87-1991/

92 capital improvements program. The council will also consider accepting the Cravlin House, 50757 Inkster, into the Farmington Hills Historic District, as well as authorizing the city manager to quit claim deed a portion of a Lot 187, Westbrook Manor subdivision No.1, to owners subject to reservation of drain and utility easements. Also to be considered is the setting

of a public hearing for removal of excess storm drainage north of Bartlett deadend, south of 13 Mile. Council will also consider an executive session to discuss labor negotiations.

Other agenda items include an annual report from the Student Round Table representative and the opening of bids for furniture and equipment for the new Eagle media center.

Beginning at this meeting is use of the new consent agenda which will cover the following items with one board vote: approval of minutes, routine personnel items, acceptance of a gift for Cloverdale Center and the purchase of a three-yard dump truck.

## Forum slated

### Hills informational parks meeting scheduled

Describing the city of Farmington Hills proposed athletic fields at the northwest corner of Farmington and 13 Mile will be the topic for the informational meeting scheduled for 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, June 4, in the North Farmington High School auditorium, 32900 13 Mile.

Members of the city's Parks and Recreation Commission and De-

partment of Special Services staff will explain the city's master parks and recreation plan, while highlighting the proposed park at 13 Mile to be used specifically for youth athletics. A fitness trail with 16 exercise stations is also planned for this park.

The proposed field is included in

the city's master parks and recreation plan, adopted last March by the Farmington Hills City Council. Including three soccer fields and two baseball/softball fields, the proposed park plan is designed to blend well with the surrounding residential property. Lighting and organized adult athletic activities are not planned

for this park. Beautiful landscaping will provide a natural green belt around the property, providing a screen to adjacent homes, according to officials.

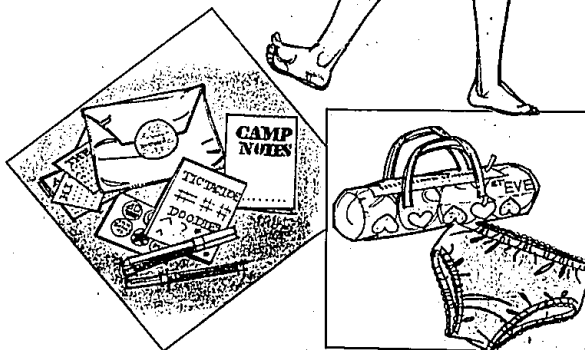
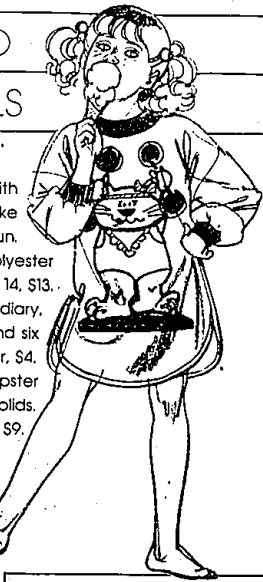
