

# Spreen eyes McDonald's county seat

Former Oakland County Sheriff Johannes Spreen will challenge incumbent Oakland County Commissioner John McDonald this fall in the 27th county commission district, which includes Farmington and much of Farmington Hills.

Spreen, a Democrat, and McDonald, a Republican, both live in Farmington Hills. McDonald was first elected in 1974.

Two other local county commissioners will face challenges in the August primary. State Rep. Wilbur Brotherton, R-Farmington, and state Sen. Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, will wait until the November general election to face opposition.

Judge Margaret Schaefer of the 47th District Court in Farmington is unopposed in her bid to seek re-election to a third six-year term. The 47th district includes Farmington and Farmington Hills.

Tuesday, June 3, was the filing deadline for this year's congressional, state, county, district and circuit court elections.

In his bid for re-election to a second two-year term in the 15th district, Oakland County Commissioner David Moffitt, R-Bloomfield Hills, will face Republican challenger Mary Lu Bennethum of Bloomfield

Township in the Tuesday, Aug. 5 primary. The primary victor will face Democratic challenger Albert Zolton of Farmington Hills in the Tuesday, Nov. 5 general election. The 15th district includes the northeast portion of Farmington Hills.

COUNTY COMMISSIONER Alexander Perinoff, D-Southfield, will face Democratic challenger Lew Barnett of Southfield in the August primary for the 21st district. Republicans Richard Lytwyniuk of Farm-

ington Hills and Douglas Sokolowski of Southfield also will square off then. The 21st district includes the southeast portion of Farmington Hills. Perinoff has been a commissioner since 1969.

Faxon, a 16-year state Senate veteran, is unopposed on the Democrat-

ic ticket in the 15th state Senate district. He will face Republican challenger Frank Brock, a Lathrup Village City Council member, in November. The 15th district includes Farmington, Farmington Hills, Southfield, Lathrup Village, Novi and Wixom. Senate terms are four years.

Brotherton, a 12-year veteran of the state House, is unopposed on the Republican ticket in the 69th state House district, which includes Farmington, Farmington Hills, Beverly Hills, Bingham Farms and Franklin. He will face Democratic challenger Michael Bresgold of Farmington in November. Bresgold chairs the Farmington Democratic Club. House terms are two years.

In the U.S. House race in the 18th congressional district, incumbent

William Broomfield, R-Birmingham, is unopposed on the GOP ticket. First elected in 1956, Broomfield will face Democratic challenger Gary Kabout of Troy in November. The 18th congressional district includes the Oakland County communities of Farmington, Farmington Hills, Novi, Wixom, Commerce, West Bloomfield, Milford, Bloomfield Hills, Birmingham, Franklin Village, Beverly Hills, Troy, Rochester and Rochester Hills, Oakland Township, Lake Orion and Addison Township.

# Center program location proposed

Botsford Elementary School in Livonia has been proposed as the location of a center program for severely emotionally impaired students.

The Clarenceville Board of Education is scheduled to take action on the plan at its June 12 meeting. If approved, Clarenceville would serve

several school districts in Oakland County. Clarenceville takes in parts of Livonia, Redford and Farmington Hills.

Participants in the program "aren't totally ready to come back into an educational classroom," said Michael Dombrowski, director of special services in Clarenceville.

"It's my understanding that the county sends SEI youngsters to Oak

Park," Botsford principal Dan Cypher said.

"There is a waiting list to get into these two classrooms. They're trying to decentralize and put places (for the program) in the four quadrants of Oakland County so that the districts do not have to bus students so far away from home."

THE PROGRAM would occupy two classrooms at the school five days a week, beginning in the 1986-

87 school year. Eight to 10 students in grades 1-6, from the Novi, Farmington, South Lyon, West Bloomfield and Walled Lake school districts, would participate. These districts would provide the transportation.


The program, including lunch, would be self-contained in the two rooms. Not all of the students may be in place at the start of the school year, but would begin over several weeks, Cypher said.

Clarenceville would receive approximately \$22,000 a year from the program. The Oakland Intermediate School District would rent the space from Clarenceville at \$3.75 a square foot, and pay a fee of 15 percent of the total program cost.

Students in the program recently have been discharged from an in-patient hospital setting, or have been receiving services in a self-contained setting without success.
