Applications should be filed by Wednesday, Oct. 7, for a special continuing education program for licensed practical nurses.

Titled "Psychology Applied to Patient Care," the course will be taught one evening a week in Veterans' Hospital, 2215 Fuller Rd., Ann Arbor. It will run for 10 weeks starting Tuesday, Oct. 13, from 7 to 8:30 p.m.

Applications should be filed with the director of Practical Nursing Education Center, 401 N. Division, Ann Arbor, 48104. Fee for the 25-hour course is \$50, payable in divided payments. Application forms and brochures may be obtained from the Michigan League for Nursing, 51 W. Warren, Detroit, 48201, or by calling the center in Ann Arbor at 662-1222.

Ann Arbor is one of eight communities in Michigan offering this course, which will be geared to understanding human behavior and the responsibilities of the nurse in care of patients showing symptoms of mental stress because of illness and disability.

The project, initiated by the Michigan League for Nursing, a United Fund agency, is the first of its kind for practical nurses and was planned in cooperation with the Michigan Licensed Practical Nurses Association.

WALTER PICKETT was best man, Steve Moore, Mike Perry, Kirby Fannin and Ron Labadie seated the guests.

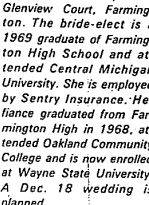

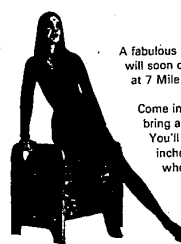
