The movie, coupled with a recent scientific genetic breakthrough late this year, has heightened awareness of the need for volunteering with Cystic Fibrosis Foundation to raise

## Registration continues at Madonna College

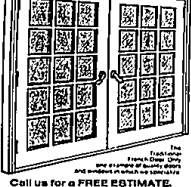

## Braille transcribers schedule fall classes

Dee Josaltis will lead the weekly Braille transcribing evenings. Classes scheduled to begin Sept. 16 sponsored by Nardin Park Braille Transcribers.

She's taking calls now from people wishing to join the volunteers in the work they do for the blind while trying to meet a Sept. 1 deadline for textbooks.

"We're swamped. We have nine textbooks due and one of them is in French and so many of our members are on vacation," Josaltis said.

"If you can read this you hold a precious gift, the gift of sight. In an effort to share our sight, we invite others to join us in this worthwhile experience of learning a skill that will benefit so many."

The volunteers that work out of Nardin Park United Methodist Church transcribe English into Braille textbooks, a priority; but also respond to requests for anything from fiction to recipes, to knitting instructions.

The course takes about seven months. There is no charge for the course, the manual or the paper, but there is a fee for the Braille writer. Upon completion of the course and manuscript, students are certified by the Library of Congress. Students take 90 minutes of class instruction each week, then master the Braille machine in their homes. Josaltis will take calls at 474-3468.
