### Will the real cost stand up?

The mortgage rate quoted by a fi-nancial institution is, of course, very confusing. The accompanying chart

shows that the total initial cost of re-financing can run into thousands of dollars, thereby wiping out part of the gain associated with refinancing.

Another way of looking at the real financing cost is to remember that a 10.875-percent mortgage rate may be equivalent to an annual percentage rate of 11.309 percent.

Pointers about points

The points tacked on to your initial cost (called loan discount) can not be fully taken as an itemized deduction in the year they are paid to stead, they must be amortized over the life of the mortgage.

This rule should be remembered in deciding if it is better to add points merely to reduce the fixed mortgage. An interesting way of looking

at points is to think of them as an investment, not cost. That way, refinancing can be one of the best investments around. Here is why.
