The group opened with old favor-ites like "Early Morning Rain" and the 17th century ballad "Come All Ye Fair and Tender Maldens." The concert's first half ended with one of the liveliest social protest songs ever written, "Day is Done." The audience clapped in time, rearing its approv-ail.

NOEL PAUL Stookey, who is orig-inally from Birmingham, was very funny, getting the crowd to sing "Rock My Soul in the Bosom of Abraham." He scrambled the parts between 'left, right and lawn peo-ple' until no one knew which part they were singing.

Peter Yarrow did terrific imita-tions of Woodward car noises (during reficience on his Dirmingham upbr-ringing), and Mary Travers, during her solo, continued "the saga of my family" as she does every year at Meadow Brook.

They sang "Leaving on a Jet Plane," and they sang their hearts out on behalf of liberty around the world. The trie soared into the stratosphere as many people on the lawn rose, candles in hand, and sang

"Blowin" in the Wind," and "Where Have All the Flowers Gone?" "If I Had A Hammer," and the powerful "Well, Well, Well," which brought ev-eryone to their feet.

"The band," bassist Dick Kniss, deserves kudos along with the trio he has been associated with for years.

Nancy Wilson, a sophisticated lady, opened for Tony Bennett, with "So Nice to Come Home to" and 'Hello, Young Lovers." Wilson's voice ran up and down the scale. She has wonderful control, and I can only marvel at her incredibly fast, clear diction, her ability to handle complex arrangements, and her sudden tonal shifts. What she does best are riffs that come out of nowhere.

WILSON'S STYLE is a bit too inti-mate for a large concert park. She needs a supper club, a small audi-ence who can lean closs and really listen to each note. You have to work to get what Wilson is singing, and a lot of her cool jarg got lost traveling from the stage through the pavilion to the lawn.

came out for the second half. Bennett hasn't get a subtle bone in his body and the crowd yelled, "We love you!" and brought flowers to lay on-stage. Sunny, good-natured Bennett was hourse, but he's a real trouper and he brought his years of expertise, his great liming and his sense of rythmn to wenderful songs like "From This Moment On," and "It Had to Be You."

He was fun to watch. He's a crooner who's at his best belting out ballads. A 30-plece orchestra did backup, and Raiph Sharon, Bennett's planist, stole the night. Sharon is an incredible plano man. Paul Langosh on bass and Joe LaBarbara, well-known drummer, helped Bennett send the crowd home happy.
