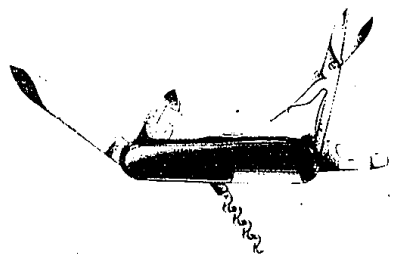
Air National Guard Base, near Mount Clemens.
