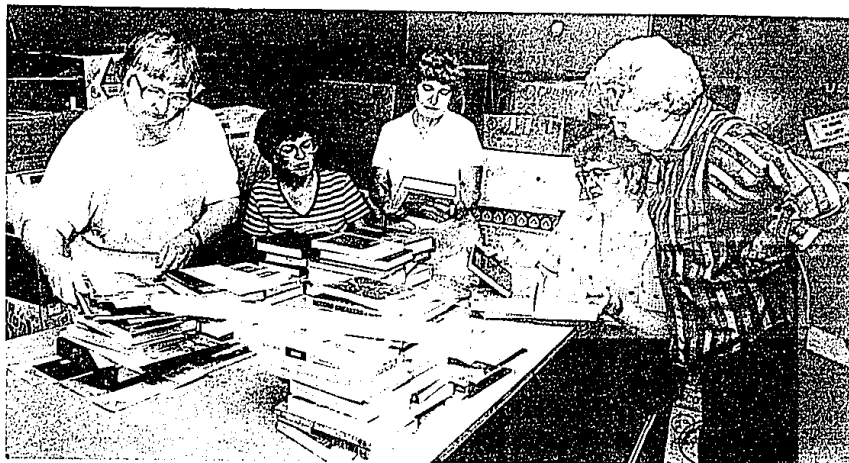


Used books for sale
