guilty pleas were entered for them. Brock and Sayers previously were pailed without bond until a Wayne Circuit judge granted a motion by their lawyers and set bond. Sayers has posted bond and is free, but Brock remains in Wayne County Jail, said Ceraid Conley, Brock's court-appointed attorney.

Brock and Sayers are accused of assaulting Link at about 2 ar... in the bar parking lot as be and bis girt-riend, Karen Layden of Livonia, were leaving the pub. Sayers' attorney, Marvin Blake, told Wayne Circuit Judge William Cabalan during a recent bond hear-ing that Brock had nothing to do with he assault on Link outside the Dou-bie OO Pub in Redford, Conley said.

BLAKE COULD not be reached for comment. A Sept. 25 trial date has been scheduled before Circuit Judge Mau-

scheduled before Circuit Judge Mau-reen Reilly. Conley said he will not attempt to plea bargain for a reduced charge against Brock. 25. "He (Brock) has never changed his story and that usually indicates hon-sety." Conley said. "I plan to put him on the (witness) stand. He comes off honest and scared." Neither Brock nor Sayers, 32, have given any court testimony about the incident.

According to Conley, Brock's ac-count is as follows:

He was returning to his Redford apartment when his van ran out of gas at Grand River and Seven Mile near the Double OO Pub and a short distance from his Grand River apartment building.

Brock walked to the apariment and began knocking on neighbors' doors for a ride to a gas station, and Sayers, who lives in the apariment next door, agreed to drive him, ac-cording to Conley.

AFTER BUYING gas and starting Brock's van, they went to the Double OO Pub for a drink, Conley said.

According to Conley, during the district court examination, Nancy Streck, a Double OO barmaid, testi-fied that Layden approached the bar and ordered a drink. Sayers, who was standing next to Layden, bought her a drink, Streck testified.

Layden testified that she initiated a conversation with Sayers and chal-lenged him to an arm-wrestling match. Aferwards, they returned to their tables, Conley said.

Conley said Layden testified that she told Brock, who was with Sayers, that he smelled good, but had no fur-ther conversation with him.

Conley said Brock claims that he and Sayers left the bar at about the same time as did Link and Layden.

Same time as our time time that dayon, Brock claims he went to his van in the bar parking lot and heard Sayers and Link shouting at each oilter, Conley said. A souffle ensued, but Brock claims he did not go near the combatants and was not involved in the fight, Conley said.

HE AND Sayers then left sepa-rately, Conley said.

Layden, the only witness to the as-sault, testified in district court that Link was struck about the head with pumerous forceful blows.

However, Bill G. Brooks, Oakland County medical examiner who per-formed the autopsy on Link, said there was no sign of bruises to Link's head or face.

Blake motioned for a reduced manslaughter charge against both defendants, but 17th District Judge Robert Brang denied the motion.
