Gov. William G. Milliken has commended the accomplishments of the Michigan Women's Commission after receiving the commission's 1969-70 progress report.

The commission, which began operation in July of 1969, is charged with studying the status of women in the state and recommending to the executive office and the Legislature methods of overcoming discrimination against women.

The governor, who boasted he has appointed 96 women to state boards and commissions, said, "The women who serve on this commission have unselfishly devoted their time and talents toward improving the status of women in Michigan."
