In Livonia-Redford

Cast Sparkles, Theater Doesn't

"The Bald Soprano" by Harold Pinter and "The Lover" by Eugene Ionesco. Little theater is a sparkling and talented infant in Livonia and Redford Townships.

We wonder if these communities know it. Seldom have we seen as impressive performances as those turned in over the week-end by five members of the Livonia-Redford Theatre Guild as they opened their fall season with two one-acts, "The Bald Soprano" by Harold Pinter and "The Lover" by Eugene Ionesco.

Proof of the power of their performances was that after the first few minutes, you were able to forget about the drab surroundings of the Guild's quarters on Beech-Daly near Five Mile. Entering is off-point, staying is a rewarding experience.

For their remaining three performances of the year, the guild will move into Bentley and Stevenson High Schools which cannot be the easiest and happiest arrangement for a little theater.

BRINGING GREAT skill to their starring roles were two newcomers to the guild, Charles Noel and Joan C. Babrowski, who played Mr. and Mrs. Smith in the Ionesco satiric comedy. They were ably backed up by three "old-timers" from the Guild, Louise Divitto, Richard Thiede and Anne Lynas.

The cabaret style presentation (the coffee and doughnuts were good) opened with the Pinter play, starring Noel and Mrs. Divitto as a couple exploring implications of the married state, particularly husband-wife, lover-mistress ramifications. Noel's performance was completely absorbing and convincing. Mrs. Divitto's a little less so.

There were more laughs in the Ionesco play, and the message was more universally applicable (not everyone is married).

It is more a play of language than of action or characterization, and the timing and the graces were perfect.

Thiede and Mrs. Lynas played the Martins, a couple who came to spend a pleasant, conversational evening with the Smiths, conversations which left you somewhat bemused.

YOU HAVE an uneasy suspicion that you have heard conversations exactly like this all too often, as the play explores the difficulties and futilities of small talk.

"If we don't listen, we won't hear you," says one of the characters. "I never thought of that," is the answer. And no one is listening, except the audience, and the clock, played by Jay Manning, looking somewhat cherubic.
