## 2 Elevated At County Hospital

Two major changes have occurred in the psychiatric division at Wayne County General Hospital, Westland. Dr. Mortezza Minuf assumed the post of clinical director replacing Dr. Sidney B. Jenkins, and Dr. Clemens Fitzgerald took over as director of the Wayne County Mental Health Clinic in Detroit, a position formerly held by Dr. Minuf.

Dr. Minuf, a native of Iran, and a graduate of Tehran University Medical School, served his internship at Women's Hospital in Detroit and his psychiatric residency at WCOH. A diplomat of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology and a fellow of the American Psychiatric Association, Dr. Minuf is also a clinical instructor at Wayne State University.

Dr. Fitzgerald, formerly director of psychiatric research and education at Wayne County General Hospital, is now director of the hospital's downtown mental health clinic located in the Washington Boulevard Building.

The clinic, with a staff of 23 provides psychiatric services on an out-patient basis for those in the community 18 years of age and over. The clinic also serves as an after-care center where patients, discharged from the hospital, are seen for follow-up visits.

## Ford To Give 70, 4-Year Scholarships

Ford Motor Co. Fund will award 70 four-year scholarships in its 21st annual competition, Benson Ford fund president, announced.

Applicants must be graduated from high school between Sept. 1, 1970, and Aug. 31, 1971, and be in the upper third of their classes. Completed scholarship applications will be accepted until Dec. 1, 1970.

The Ford Fund also makes a supplementary annual grant of \$500 to privately endowed educational institutions for each fund scholarship winner in attendance.

College Night is just one of several means RU counselors are using to help students and parents make plans for education beyond high school.

At a meeting on Sept. 30, RU

parents learned about procedures for application and admission to college, financial aids, and tests required for entrance or scholarships.

Walker R. Greene, assistant director of financial aids at the University of Detroit, spoke on applying for financial aid.

Distributed to parents at the meeting and to students in their homeroom classes were guidelines to planning for education beyond high school, compiled by the RU counseling staff. The material includes general information on college choices; application for admission, scholarships, grants, and loans; and pre-college tests.

College catalogs are available for overnight loan in the counselors' office, and information regarding colleges may be found on bulletin boards in the counseling lobby.

Mrs. Reva Glenn and Milo Karbu, senior counselors, are available to advise students on college decisions. Applications may be picked up in the counselors' office, and are submitted to the colleges through counselors.
