Schooleraft College's womens soccer team, plagued by injuries and absentees, picked up a player early last week. And what a player. Amy Weber, the Livonial Churchill grad, pumped in two goals and assisted on a third in the Lady Ocelots' 3-2 win over Siena Heights.

The game seemed more like a Livonia all-star game than a match of two state college teams. Siena Heights just promoted its womens club team to varsity, and coach Doug Mello quickly recruited a team by signing eight Observerland players, six from Stevenson High School.


