## Immunization is emphasized

Oakwood Hospital's immunization program, recognized as a distinguished community health promotion program by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, has received the 1988 Secretary's Award for Excellence.

It was presented to Gerald Fitzgerald, president of Oakwood Health Services Corp., by Dr. James Harrison, deputy director for programs, Michigan Department of Public Health, at the hospital's third annual health promotion conference. Joining Fitzgerald were Farmington Hills residents Dr. Max Lichter, director of the Community Health

and Health Education Department, and Margaret Kish, an Oakwood Hospital Guild volunteer who coordinated the program for four years.

The program, which began in 1981, is conducted by Oakwood Hospital Guild volunteers who visit new mothers in the obstetrics unit to explain the importance of childhood immunization.

As part of the program, the compliance rate of participating children at 4 months and 18 months of age is monitored. Thus far, the overall rate is estimated to be more than 95 percent.
