Members Tell About Antiques

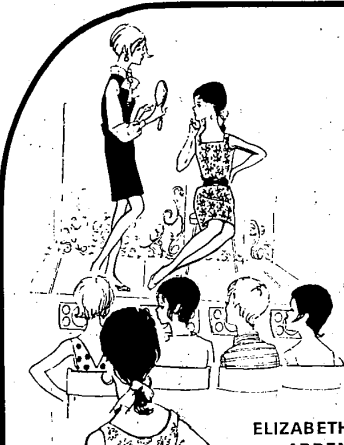
