Cooperative Plan Introduced At OU

Oakland University, Roches-ter, in a cooperative arrange-ment with the Midrash Col-lege of Jewish Studies, is offer-ing this year for the first time courses in Hebrew language and culture. The courses will be taught at Oakland by faculty from the Midrasha, a private, under-graduate institution in South-field, William Sturner. Oak-land's active vice provost, said.

A SIMILAR COOPERATIVE arrangement exists in this area between the Midrasha and the University of Detroit.

This winter Oakland will offer another course in Hebrew language and one in history, and beginning with the fall 1971, approximately four courses will be offered each term. The maximum enrollment of 25

students has been achieved for the fall language course and a waiting list has been estab-lished.


lished. The new cooperative arrangement will not entail a study in religion, but will be concerned with the analysis of Heraic studies as a scientific, academic discipline, Sturner said. The courses do not represent a separate program or major field of concentration, rather they may be taken individually by Oskland students enrolled in a variety of majors.

Oakland and the Midrasha have cooperated in the past to the extent that students at the Midrasha have taken their general education courses at Oakland and then returned to their own institution for spe-cialized courses.
