Firefighters pact ratified

A new three-year contract be-tween Farmington Hills fireflighters and the city was ratified Dec. 8, pro-viding 4-percent annual increases and additional pension and insurance

and additional pension and benefits.
The city council voted unanimous benefits.
The city council voted unanimous by to approve the pact for members of the international Association of Fire Fighters Local 2589, effective from July 1, 1986 through June 30, 1989, according to information from the city.

When the contract expired, the city and union agreed to extend the current contract until negotiating teams reached an impasse and entered into mediation Nov. 12—when a tentality agreement was reached.
Other new contract wage provisions include:

• A clause calling for a higher percentage increase for firelighters if another city union negotiates more than 4 pere ent during the life of the contract.

Removal of classifications of ileutenant and fire marshal from overtime provisions, moving them to straight salary.

Compensation for coquired court appearances and jury duty.
 In addition, fireflighters will receive an increase for annual tui-tion and education relimbursement.
 Formerly at 2 percent of base sai-ary, contract changes move the fig-ure to 3 percent of the highest base rate for a fireflighter.

In the area of promotions, an eligibility roster will be established for all classifications below deputy free chief, a position that was removed from the bargaining unit.

Future promotions will be based on a combined score of seniority, written and oral examinations and departmental evaluations.


Last February, the paving project costs were estimated at \$164,737, including work on the street drainage, according to the report.


