


Glitter that makes the season bright



Margo Sundquist's home at 32905 Grand River is an eye-catcher for passersby most of the year. When the summer gardens fade, Halloween spooks and then November scare-




Motorists driving south on Hamilton Boulevard from 12 Mile are greeted by carolers at the entryway to Alexander Hamilton Life Insurance building.
