Listed are some of the Farmington-area police and fire calls received during the past week:

● **ATTEMPTED LARCENY**
A woman tried to pull a larceny by trick at the 7-Eleven at 22323 Middlebelt Jan. 5.

According to a Farmington Hills police report:

The woman, who appeared to be about 30, gave the cashier one \$5 bill and five \$1 bills. She then asked for and received a \$10 bill. The cashier switched as the woman switched the \$10 bill with a \$1 bill and claimed she was given the smaller bill instead of the larger bill. The woman left when her claim was challenged.

● **CARS VANDALIZED**

Damage was estimated at \$2,750 when the windows of 12 cars parked on or near Old Homestead were shattered Jan. 3-4. A BB or pellet gun possibly could have been used, according to Farmington Hills police reports.

The man allegedly was seen putting on a black Members Only jacket, then taking off the price tag and placing it in his pocket before leaving.

Pedestrian hit by car

An 81-year-old resident of Farmington Place, 32900 Grand River, was struck by a car and cut on the head Jan. 2 as she crossed Grand River, just east of School, in downtown Farmington.

The state has approved a pedestrian-activated traffic signal for the intersection, with installation expected in 1987 or 1988, city officials said. Farmington Place residents have written state officials urging immediate installation of the signal on the state-owned avenue.

According to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report,

the woman was crossing Grand River from the north side when a 27-year-old Plymouth woman pulled onto eastbound Grand River from southbound School. The pedestrian was struck in the center of the road. The car stopped just as the pedestrian was hit.

The driver was ticketed for alleged failure to yield.

"Will they wait until one of the seniors is killed to do something?" one of the victim's neighbors said. "She's not the first one hit."

The man was released pending a warrant.
