TOP PERFORMER

Meanwhile, the Myrtle Beach cadet squadron of the Civil Air Patrol was selected as South Carolina's "Squadron of the Year" for 1986. The selection was announced at the South Carolina's Civil Air Patrol conference.

According to Sgt. Zeitunian, commander of the Myrtle Beach cadet squadron, the unit won the award for "its outstanding participation in many wing functions and program achievements."

In addition to winning CAP wing "top honors," members captured a Unit Citation Award for their performance during a higher headquarters management effectiveness inspection. The unit was one of the top two squadrons in the state as determined by the results of the inspection.
