CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING JANUARY 12, 1987

Mayor Marks opened the regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on January 12, 1987 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Alkatech, Dolan, Dudley, Marks, Sover, Soronen and Wolf. Others present: City Manager Conkling, City Clerk Reynolds, Assistant City Manager Call, City Attorney Eberhart, and Invocations were given by Rabbi Elry G. Speiser of Adath Shalom Synagogue. Minutes of December 8, 1986 were approved as amended and minutes of December 15, 1986 and January 5, 1987 were approved as published.

Mayor proclaimed week of January 27-31, 1987 as Family Achievement Week. Council enacted Ordinance No. C-1-87, Zoning Request 31-9-88, to remove property north of Eight Mile, west of Gull, Tax ID 23-33-376-031 from R-A-3 to R-C-2. Council enacted Ordinance No. C-3-87, relative to sale of property on Twelve Mile Road for relocation of Harger House.

Determination was made by Council not to proceed with sanitary sewer for Kirby Avenue.

Council acknowledged intention of Michigan Department of Social Services to license Adult Foster Care Family Home at 22834 Colgate. No action was taken.

Council accepted request from Michigan Sequelcentennial Oakland County Advisory Council to participate in their Sequelcentennial celebration of the Statehood of Michigan on January 24, 1987.

Expenses of \$68.00 were approved for four Council members to attend Michigan Municipal League Region IV meeting on January 12, 1987.

Resignation of Margaret Downs from the Board of Canvassers was accepted by Council.

Council determined to increase marriage ceremony fee from \$18.00 to \$35.00. Recommendation was accepted from City Clerk to have City Code updated and republished in "plain English" by Municipal Code Corporation of Tallahassee, Florida, at cost not to exceed \$22,000.

Council adopted Resolution relative to Enactment of Federal Clean Water Act reauthorization.

Public Hearing date of February 16, 1987 was established for consideration of vacation of public alley in Section 35.

City Manager was authorized to issue the following purchase orders:

- To Midwest Energy in amount of up to \$70,165 for City's annual supply of truck transport delivered gasoline and diesel fuel.
- To Plymouth Oil in amount of up to \$5,988 for City's annual supply of tank wagon delivered gasoline and diesel fuel.
- To EPCO Equipment Company, Inc. in amount of \$3,000 for purchase of two (2) Bennett Fleet Master fuel pumps model 3785 for Department of Public Works; and
- To Bear Automotive - Great Lakes Inc. in amount of \$17,465.00 for Engine Diagnostic/Four Gas Analyzer for Division of Public Works garage.

Council granted two-year extension until January 19, 1989 for final preliminary plat for Strathmore Subdivision in Section 7.

Final Preliminary Plat for Farmington Glen Subdivision No. 2 and No. 3 in Section 6 was approved.

Council granted extension of Open Space completion for Hunt Club Subdivision in Section 20 to June 1, 1987.

Ordinance was introduced, authorizing City Manager to execute Warranty Deed transferring parcels 15-30-270-017 and 018 to Cadillac Golf and Country Club. City Manager was authorized to issue purchase orders to IBM in amount of \$23,690.75 and CGE Enterprises in amount of \$8,777.00 for purchase of computer hardware for various City departments.

Council approved additional appropriation to Budget in amount of \$18,453.00 for computer upgrade for 47th District Court.

Date of January 28, 1987 at 7:30 p.m. was established for a joint City Council/Parks and Recreation Commission Meeting; to be held at Heritage Park Spicer House.

Planning Commission Chairman, Philip Arnold, addressed Council regarding better communication between City Council and Planning Commission.

Council determined to hold Executive Session following meeting to discuss pending litigation.

Meeting adjourned at 10:25 p.m.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.

Council received and filed a City of Oak Park resolution relative to Michigan's public recreation infrastructure.

Council received notice from the National League of Cities concerning the upcoming Congressional-City Conference.

Council instructed the administration to develop a Traffic Control Order temporarily suspending Brookdale Street from permit parking.

Council granted the requested sign variance for Denzler's Restaurant at 3320 Grand River and instructed that the present wall sign be removed.

Council ratified the Public Safety Dispatchers' 3-year Agreement effective July 1, 1988 through June 30, 1989, authorizing the City Manager to sign said agreement on behalf of the City.

Council approved hiring an additional maintenance person for the Water/Sewer Department.

Council was advised of the City's \$30,000.00 Michigan Equity Grant for Farmington Museum Improvements.

Council was advised by the City of Detroit of proposed adjustments in wholesale water and sewer rates.

Council approved the purchase of 23 home alerting monitors to the amount of \$9,533.50.

Council authorized the purchase of Public Safety answering point equipment for the 911 system.

Council awarded the contract for the installation of an edge drain along Power and Shawanawee Roads to the low bidder, Str-S, Inc., of Keego Harbor in the amount of \$11,233.00.
