Monday night, the Farmington school board met in "executive" session and decided to accept the recommendations of the factlin-der. Teachers held a meeting last night (Tuesday) to take a vote on accepting the report. report

If teachers vote to accept the factfinders' recommendations, ratification of a contract could follow the board's formal acceptance at Monday night's regularly scheduled board meeting. Teachers have been working without a contract since school opened.

Farmington's Board of Education failed to endorse a pro-posal Monday night that would provide for separation and freezing of the county's tax limitation millage.

Imitation millage. The Oakland County Tax Allocation Board petitioned the County Board of Commission ers to include the millage quesi-tion on the November ballot. IN FFFECT, the county is asking residents to raise their own property taxes by three mills (32 per 31,000 assessed valuation) from 15 to 18 mills. Supt. Roderick Smith said that prior to this time state law assigned authority for the County Allocation Board to levy a tax of 15 mills to be split among four government agencies-schools, townships and Oakland County.
