

OCC Runs Normally Without Contract

Oakland Community College is no nearer a teacher contract settlement than Sept. 17 when the Faculty Association (OCCFA) refused to ratify a pact for 1970-71.

OCCFA BARGAINING chairman Rodney Case from the Orchard Ridge campus told the Observer that "business is running about normal" at the college with classes operating on schedule.

He said school reopened on time after teachers agreed to return to work under terms of the 1969-70 master contract. Another OCCFA spokesman said negotiators meet three hours a day, seven days a week, and will continue until a new contract agreement is reached.

"About the only new development to report since OCCFA members voted down the proposed administration contract is the election of new OCCFA officers," Chase said.

NEW OCCFA delegate bargainers from each campus are John Homestier and Jack Inch, Orchard Ridge; Dennis Fiems and John Lundgren, Highland Lakes; and Tom Keel and Henry Gram, Auburn Hills. Chase said he "couldn't predict" whether a settlement would be reached within the foreseeable future.

FARMINGTON Formation of a new committee seeking broad-based support for Farmington Township trustee candidate Burton Levy has been announced by committee co-chairmen Mrs. Pat Smith and Paul Dietz.

"The problems facing the township are so critical at this time that it is absolutely imperative that the most capable and effective man be elected, regardless of party affiliation." The committee is hoping that voters will set party politics aside.
