"Partisans of Vilna" premiere planned

The Michigan premiere showing of "Partisans of Vilna" will be sponsored by the Center for the Study of the Child to benefit the Holocaust Curriculum Project.

The showing begins at 8 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 12 in Maple Theater, on Maple Road west of Telegraph. "Partisans of Vilna" is an acclaimed 1986 documentary film chronicling Jewish resistance to the Nazis in the eastern European city of Vilna, Lithuania.

The film's Washington-based producer, Aviva Kempner, will introduce it and answer questions after the showing. Kempner grew up in Detroit and Southfield and attended Cass Technical High School and the University of Michigan.

Proceeds from the benefit will fund the development and distribution of a new Holocaust curriculum for use in high schools. The curriculum is being written by Dr. Sidney Bolkosky of University of Michigan-

Dearborn; Betty Elias, a Southfield high school teacher; and Dr. David Harris, director of Oakland Schools Social Studies Programs.

Prime sponsors of the curriculum are the Center for the Study of the Child and the Jewish Community Council.

"Partisans of Vilna" has opened to two reviews in New York, Boston, Washington, and Los Angeles and has been highly praised on televi-

sion's "Sneak Previews." It combines rare newsreel and archive footage with new interviews to give a portrait of Jewish resistance during the occupation.
