More than risque business

Meadow Brook's energetic pro-duction of George Feydean's "A Flea in Her Ear" raises the art of double entendre to new heights. Literally translated the French phrase means "double hearing."

Feydeau goes beyond usual risque innuendos and plays with sounds in general, with languages, even with speech impediments. Nothing is accred and the stage ricochets with the humor of communication run anok.

Director Carl Schurr gives each character a distinctive style, and he gives many a distinguishing sound as well. The decidion to change the play's setting was unfortunate because set design-was unfortunate because set design-er Peter Bicks has always arcelled at re-creating turn-of-the-century el-

egance on the Meadow Brook stage.
His version of Parisian decor in
the '20s doesn't measure up. Despite
the peculiar set, the play's good humor thrives, thanks to an expert cast
