

Leontyne Price guest at Ford Auditorium



She is the recipient of America's highest civilian award, the Presidential Medal of Freedom, which she received in 1985 from President Lyndon Johnson.

Her program at Ford Auditorium will include works by Handel, Mozart, Marx, Strauss, Puccini, Poulenc and Holby. Her accompanist will be David Garvey.



A view of the ancient past



ing, bearded, wide-eyed Sumerian land surveyor named Shubim standing in eternal worship before his gods, circa 2500 B.C. At right is a memorial relief of Aamat, identified as mother of Nebozabab and wife of Barikai. The exhibit continues through May 3.


