**CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)**

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Hartsock at 8:00 p.m. on February 2, 1987, in Council Chambers, 35600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.

**PRESENT:** Campbell, Hartsock, Richardson, Tupper, Yoder.

**OTHERS PRESENT:** City Manager Deadman, Director Billing, Director Lashoff, City Attorney Kelly, City Clerk Binsley.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.

Council denied Thomas DeWard's request to remove the building at 33804 Grand River from the DDA District, and referred the matter of R-10 zoning to the Planning Commission.

Council received notice from the Michigan Municipal League of the upcoming Legislative Conference.

Council received and filed the Liquor Control Commission notice relative to an SDM license for Perry Drugs, and took no action on the SDM license for 23301 Orchard Lake Road.

Council accepted the proposed program for the 1987 Major Road Repair Program. Instructed that plans and specifications be prepared for the project and that the City Manager have the city bonding authority prepare the necessary documents for the sale of \$750,000 in Act 51 highway revenue bonds to finance the project.

Council adopted Resolution Nos. 1 and 3 of the Special Assessment process and established a public hearing on Necessity for Chatham Hills Subdivision Roads on Monday, February 23, 1987.

Council awarded the bid for Plastic Trash Can Liners to Arrow Industries of Dallas, Texas, in the amount of \$7,213.

Public comments were heard.

**ORDINANCE NO. C-544-87**

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 39 OF TITLE V, ARTICLE 2, SCHEDULE REGULATIONS (SCHEDULE B) FOOTNOTE (I) OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF FARMINGTON**

**THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:**

ADD second paragraph as follows:

The Planning Commission may reduce the setback and road right-of-way width requirements when in the opinion of the Commission, the parcel of land under consideration has characteristics such as size, shape or other conditions that makes development difficult within the normal setback requirements. In no case shall the setback be less than the setbacks required within an R-1, One-Family District.

Mayor Marks opened the regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on February 9, 1987 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Alkatech, Dolan, Dudley, Marks, Sever, Soronen, and Wolf. Others present: City Manager Conlick, City Clerk Reynolds, Assistant City Manager Call, and City Attorney Bibeau.

Minutes of January 19, 1987 and January 26, 1987 were approved as amended. Council approved removal of Tulipwood Street barricade between Quail Hollow and Valley Forge in Section 8.

The following ordinances were enacted:
