

# Spartans eye 4th Schoolcraft title

Lee Cagle and his Livonia Stevenson volleyball team have won the Schoolcraft Invitational championship the last three years. That's unprecedented in the history of the tournament.

You might think winning it that many times would make the Spartans complacent this year.

"I told the girls that if we could win it a fourth straight time, that record may never be matched," Cagle said. "We have a chance to do something very special."

IT WON'T be easy. Walled Lake Central (19-2), Walled Lake (13-3), Garden City (30-0), Redford Bishop Borgess (18-7) and Livonia Ladywood (23-4) will be among the 30 teams looking to challenge the Spartans. Fenton and Dearborn as well as North Farmington and Farmington Harrison, are dark horse entries who have the ability to wind up in the finals.

"Hey, on any given day teams can just play out of their minds," Cagle said. "We're heading into the last part of the season and every team has improved. If we come in flat, we could get beat."
