**SKI TOUR** — From 7-10 p.m. Friday, Feb. 13, you can join us as we cross country ski at Heritage Park. No fee will be charged for this special event. Ski rental will be available.

**NATURE STUDY** — Farmington-area families may tour Heritage Park to learn the different signs of wildlife that make the 212-acre park

their home. Tim Nowicki will begin the nature interpretive program by explaining how wildlife adapts to and uses the land in its life cycle. The nature program will be held from 10 a.m. to noon Saturday, Feb. 21. If there is sufficient snow, cross country skis are recommended. However, non-skiers are still invited to participate. Registration deadline is Tuesday, Feb. 17, or until the maximum registration of 25 is reached. Fee is \$3 per person or \$7 per family.

**SKI CENTERS** — Farmington-

area residents are encouraged to join us at the two cross country ski centers, Glen Oaks Golf Course, on 13 Mile east of Orchard Lake Road, and Heritage Park on Farmington Road, between 10 and 11 Mile. Both centers are open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. Heritage Park also is open 1-5 p.m. Tuesday and Thursday. Ski rental is available at both sites. Rental rates are \$6 for two hours.

**YOUTH BOWLING** — In cooperation with Bel-Aire, Country, and Norwest Lanes, a learn-to-bowl program for children in grades 3-5 will

be offered. Individuals are taught the correct lane approach, ball delivery, timing and scoring. Classes begin the week of March 2, 4-3:30 p.m. Fee is \$15 and is required by the Feb. 27 registration deadline.
