● NIGHT OUT

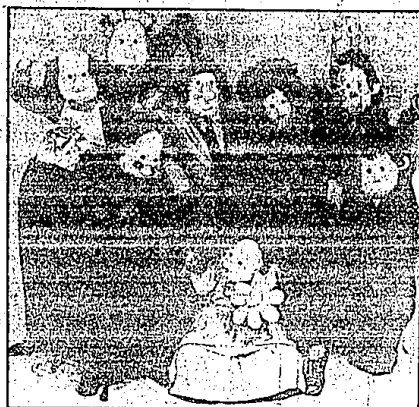
