Prix de Rome, National Institute of Arts & Letters, National Endowment for the Arts, Koussevitsky Foundation, UNESCO, Guggenheim, Naumberg, and Fulbright Awards.

Torke (b. 1981) graduated in composition and plano from the Eastman School of Music in 1984. His instructors include Martin Bresnik, Christopher Rouze, Jacob Druckman, and Joseph Schwantner.
