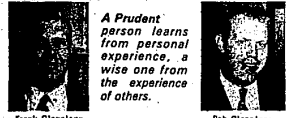

Mary Wagner Named 'Teacher of the Year'

FARMINGTON "Outstanding teacher of the year in special education" was the award received by Farmington's Mrs. Mary Wagner at a dinner dance Friday in the Royal House in Warren. It was presented by the Oakland County Assn. for Retarded Children.

A teacher of retarded youngsters at North Farmington High School, Mrs. Wagner devotes her life to helping these young adults make it in a normal world.

Morning classes are followed by afternoon rounds of checking with local employers who give jobs to juniors and seniors showing the necessary determination and dependability to hold the jobs.

RECENT MONTHS were spent matching employers and workers who were to be in-

olved in a vocational rehabilitation plan to give some much needed on-the-job training to these young people with federal funds to reimburse the participating companies for salaries during the learning period.

After battling the attendant red tape, Mrs. Wagner received word that unfortunately no more federal funds were available for this facet of the program this year, so all plans had to be revised.

Not deterred, she persevered, and is watching four young trainees who are successfully adapting to kitchen, laundry, housekeeping, and janitorial duties in a local nursing home under a program adjusted to fit the new situation.

A great deal of follow-up work must be fitted into Mrs. Wagner's schedule. With eight juniors involved in half-time

positions and 10 seniors who are eligible to work full time, each must be checked on at least once a week to insure that things are running smoothly. Employers grade the students just as they would for a report card.

Besides, there are at least 10 former graduates (Mrs. Wagner has had in North since 1966) who are still under her wing.

HER LIVING situation too, is ultimately related to the needs of these young people. Fourteen of them share the Wagner household, going back and forth to responsible jobs in the community each day. "The public must be edu-

cated to realize that these young people are not mentally ill," Mrs. Wagner says.

will now be written into the contract include: class size limitations; agreement that transfer of teachers from one building to another would be made on the basis of seniority; and an agreement that if a grievance is filed and the board does not answer by the deadline that remedy will be granted to the aggrieved party.

An issue earlier resolved was an agency shop clause which provides that teachers who are not members of the FEA or who do not pay the equivalent of union dues as assessed members will be after 60 days from the opening of fall classes.

Other issues settled previously include: full health insurance coverage would be maintained; life insurance provided by the district would be increased from \$7,500 to \$10,000; and mileage allowance will be raised to 11 cents a mile.

Also negotiated earlier was an increase in the retirement severance benefit paid teachers. Under last year's contract, teachers would receive \$100 for each year of employment in the district up to 30 years. That figure has been raised to \$125.

Another issue settled involves payments made to teachers for extra duty performed. Coaches will receive a one per cent raise for athletic services performed.

None of the present payments made for extra duty will be reduced. Extra duty payments for other employees will remain the same as in 1969-70 with the exception of junior high vocal music teachers who will receive a five per cent hike.
