Rosenquist's 'Star Thief' installed at museum

The enigmatic and colorful Siar Thief, a monumental painting by noted American Pop artist James Roceanquis, was installed at the De-troit Institute of Arts this week.

The painting, 46 feet long by 17 feet high, was Rosenquist's "diary" of his feelings and throught during the 1820 election period. Siar Thier will erman on the north wall of the inseamo's Prentis Court for three years on long-term loan from Burton Kanter of Chicago, III.

"At the start of his career Rosenguist painted billboards in Minneapolis and New York," and Jan van der Marck, DIA curator of Twenti-the Century Art. Van der Marck's enthusiaum for Star Thief goes back to 1981. As director of the Minmi Center for the Fino Arts and a member of Dade Country Art in Public Places Committee, he advocated purchase of Star Thief for installation in a yet-to-built Eastern Airlines concourse at Minmi International Airport. Eastern chalman Frank Borman opposed the selection Fierce artistic and political dehates enupted. The airport project was tabled and the committee dishanded, but the painling was shown in 1983 at the Center

for the Fine Arts.
In 1933, Star Thief surfaced in a touring retrospective exhibition, which also included Rosenquist's 10 y 85 foot and-war statement, F-111 (1945). G-111 sold for a Rosenquist record of \$2.09 million at the Scull auction last year.)

Rosenquist is generally considered to belong to the "hard core" of Pop art, a distinction he shares with Claes Oldenburg, Andy Warbel and Roy Lichtenstein.

Great collectors of that era — Joseph Hirshborn, Mary Sialer, Robert Scull and Gluseppi Panna di Blumo — bought his work between 1961 and 1963. He was included in the landmark Americans 1963 exhibition. Philip Johnson commissioned him to plant a mural for the 1964 World's Fair in New York.

Rosenquist now lives in Aripeka, Florida, and keeps a studio in New York City.

The Detroit installation of Star Thief was another kind of monumerial performance. The painting consists of 33 panels which must be bolted together. An elaborate system of cable, block and tackle was required to hoist the 1200-046-pound work of art, after the panels were fitted together in rows like the pattern a brickinyer uses in putting up a wall.




